HOT AutoCAD Tip!

This question was received by one of our members. "When I open someone else's AutoCAD drawing, it will come up with missing Shape Fonts (*.shx) files (i.e. Guard, Ret_Wall,...). I know they are linetypes but how do I get them? I had them eTransmit the file... shouldn't they have come with it?"

Here was my answer: there are options in the eTransmit command to not include font files... unfortunately, eTransmit may see shape files as font files (same extension) and fail to include them. Set it to include fonts.

Also note that eTransmit does not send the actual linetype definition file, so you would not be able to reload the linetype. ❖LB
